Safer and Updated Facilities for Students & Staff

- ✓ Horizon Middle School has not been updated in **37 years**
- ✓ It must be brought up to current safety standards
- ✓ Renovations will also increase capacity from **480 to 600 students**.

Solutions for a Growing Central Valley

- ✓ Since 2000 areas in CVSD have grown by nearly **60%**
- ✓ Projected middle school enrollment in the fall of 2020 is **3,580** – current enrollment is **3,180** – current middle school capacity is **3,125**
- ✓ CVSD started **68** kindergarten classes in the fall of 2017
- ✓ There are over **4,200** students attending our 2 high schools – designed to fit only **3,200** students
- ✓ Projected enrollment for 2021 is **4,492** – **1,292** students more than current capacity
- ✓ Our 2 high schools have **18** portable classrooms
- ✓ We have over **35** teachers without classrooms teaching on mobile carts.

Know the Facts

- ✓ On February 13, 2018, Central Valley voters will be asked to consider approval of a \$129.9 million construction bond
- ✓ If approved that will bring a state match of \$27.4 million for every \$1 invested, the school district leverages an additional \$.85 from the state
- ✓ **Voter approval will NOT increase your current tax rate**

Strong Schools Create a Vibrant Economy

- ✓ With the approval of our 2015 bond our construction projects had a one-time economic impact of \$360 million and an annual economic impact of \$370 million

New Comprehensive High School –

expand high school capacity by 1,600 students at the 16th & Henry site purchased for this purpose in 1980.

Horizon Middle School Renovation –

renovate and expand the original 1980 school building, increase capacity from 480 to 600 students, and upgrade it to current codes and safety standards.

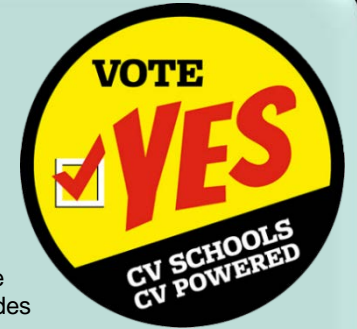
New Middle School –

expand middle school capacity by 600 students in the Telido Station area (near the HUB).

Traversing the Traffic

With the addition of a third comprehensive high school, traffic would be reduced at the existing high schools.

- ✓ For the new site at Henry and 16th, the district is proactively studying and facilitating traffic improvements – working together with both City and County offices to mitigate all appropriate traffic
- ✓ CVSD is committed to making traffic improvements to Henry Road within the existing 50-foot right-of-way for safety of our students and the community
- ✓ These include a standard 12-foot asphalt-paved travel lane and a four-foot shoulder bike lane, curb, landscape buffer and a sidewalk or bicycle pedestrian pathway



QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

Q: What is the difference between a bond and a levy?

A: Bonds are for buildings and levies are for learning. School programs enrichment levies pay for daily school programs and operations. Construction bonds fund capital projects including renovating and building new schools. Central valley School District will ask voters to consider approval of both a bond and a levy on February 13, 2018.

Q: Why not just add more portable classrooms?

A: Portable classrooms are a temporary solution already in place with 30 classrooms at multiple Central Valley schools, including 12 at Central Valley High School and six at University High School. Portables are costly to purchase and install – up to \$300,000 each. And, they are less secure than housing students inside school buildings.

Q: What is the timeline if voters approve the bond?

A: School design will begin immediately following voter approval. The new and renovated middle schools would likely be complete by 2020 and the new high school by 2021.

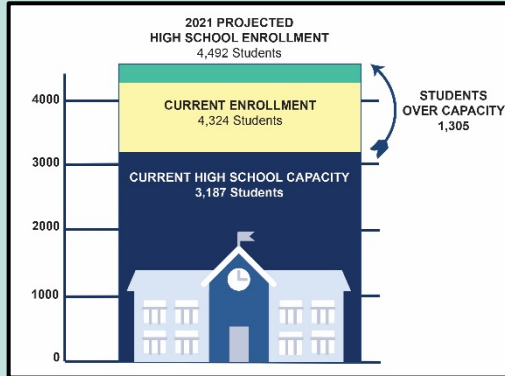
Q: What will the new boundaries be?

A: Because our population will grow between now and fall of 2021 when a new high school would open, boundaries would be set in 2020.

Q: What will you do to address traffic congestion?

A: Traffic would be reduced at the existing high schools. For the new site at 16th and Henry, the district is proactively facilitating traffic improvements by working with City and county offices as well as purchasing property for this purpose.
